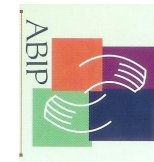

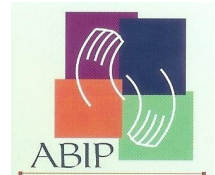

ABIP FACULTY OF EXPERTS

Lynda Campbell - Currently volunteers at Angel Step Inn Emergency DV Shelter. Lynda, formerly a staff member at Haven House, Inc. for 24 years, is an experienced counselor & group facilitator for male & female recovery programs, with emphasis on the impact of addiction on domestic violence.

Mary Case, CCDVC - Mary is a nationally Certified Domestic Violence Counselor and the board member of ABIP. She has worked in the field of DV for more than fifteen years and has focused her work in the area of LGBTQ DV, providing hundreds of trainings and workshops locally and at the national level.

Michael Cochran - Michael either facilitates or co-facilitates DV groups at these agencies: Alternatives, LTD in Encino, Foothill Family Services, and The Valley Prevention & Treatment Center. He also has an expertise in intervention techniques for partner abuse, targeting self-esteem issues, anger, rage and family violence and overall relationship issues.

Dean Eddy has been working in the DV field for over twenty-two years. For seventeen of those years he was the Director of Client Services for the Abuse Prevention Program at the Southern Calif. Counseling Center and was facilitating at least three men’s groups and one women’s group per week; working both with male and female offenders and survivors groups. He has since moved on to better serve the community as a consultant. Dean is a long time member of ABIIP and is currently on its board.

Kendall Evans, LMFT—Another Way & Open Paths Counseling Center. She has worked with IPV abuser & survivors of abuse since 1987 ; co-founder of Another Way; psychotherapist at Open Paths counseling Center. Kendall is Co-Chair of ABIP and is its training chair.

Isabella Goeders, MS, Is an MFT Intern at the Chinatown Service Center in LA where she is a therapist working with families, parenting and DV facilitator. She was one of the founding members of the Asian Pacific Islander DV Task Force (API DV Task Force) in 2004. Isabella was one of the recipients of the 2013 Women of the Year for years of volunteer and advocate work done with DV victims.

Alyce LaViolette MS, MFT - Founder of Alternatives to Violence in 1979; and has worked with battered women since 1978. Alyce is both a national and international speaker and trainer, an expert witness, and best-selling author for Safe Publications, with the 3rd edition of her book, “It Could Happen To Anyone; Why Women Stay.”

Maria Leyva has over 28yrs experience working in the DV field. She worked at Valley Family Center for 19yrs.as a director of the DV program. Maria presently works at the Jewish Family Services of LA as a residential counselor from ‘95 to the present and has worked in collaboration with the LA Juvenile, family & criminal courts, probation, parole, and DCFS depts. In 2011 Maria developed her new agency and is the executive director & founder of The Children Safety Alliance.

Bernita Walker has been in the DV field for 36 years and is a survivor of abuse, in her own life. She is co-founder & executive director of Project PeaceMakers, Inc. and has overseen the training of countless community members in the fight against abuse. Ms. Walker is also co-founder of the Jenesse Center, a shelter serving DV victims and their children.
